As the new year begins, our community remains steadfast in our focus on the goals of the previous year: solidifying and defining our community and the wider agency, with the goal of eventual expansion of clubhouse in Minnesota. We started the year strong with a clubhouse coalition meeting in Silver Bay to help their community open an accredited clubhouse soon. We have also been working hard to establish connections in Ramsey County with service providers and potential members alike, hoping to have a strong, established network of members and resources when we open a new clubhouse in Saint Paul this spring. Similar to how we have adapted to new circumstances, the wider agency has worked hard in collaboration with our community to redefine itself and create a new name and mission statement. As we advance, the new name for our clubhouses and the wider agency will be Vail Communities, and the mission statement will be Vail creates pathways to recovery through relationships, purpose, and opportunity. Thank you again to all who contributed to this process! As we gear up for yet another busy year ahead in which we hope to open a new clubhouse and grow the number of those we serve to be 2 to 3 times what we serve now, I want to highlight again the importance of all the work we do as a community, not just for each other, the community, and one's recovery, but for continuing to ensure that we will no longer be the best kept secret in the state. Thanks to all of you who have helped make this journey to clubhouse expansion possible and to impact the lives of others who don't even know clubhouse exists yet!

NATE'S NOTES

Three Vail Clubhouses is the reality we are working towards. How we go from 1 shared clubhouse to 3 will be a topic of discussion for many months in 2024. It means we face more changes, but these changes are building the foundations for something great for the state of Minnesota. Our clubhouses have been no stranger to changes since 2020, but many of those changes came from events and forces outside of the clubhouse. The changes we need to make now come from within and will be community driven. Therefore the community needs to be put in charge of shaping the future of our clubhouses. Systematically we will work toward 3 clubhouses with a series of community driven days. The combined clubhouse will remove staff for an entire day and allow the community to take charge of the work of the clubhouse. This process will occur throughout 2024 as a means of testing the readiness of our clubhouses with reduced staffing. When we divide in half there will no longer be 2 staff in each department. There may be no staff in a department on a given day. Can we still function as a clubhouse? The answer should be yes. Anything but yes means we aren't ready for concious decoupling to occur. This is how we prove we are ready to move to the next stages. The process may be messy, it may be chaotic, but it is meant to slowly test the waters before diving into the deep end. Anything we learn from these days will be part of our action plan towards decoupling. Mark your calendars for March 18th for our first attempt at a staffless day at the Hopkins **Clubhouse.** (Nate will be present to help open and close the clubhouse.)






